THE ANIMAL PESTS ACT.

[BURMA ACT IX, 1939.] (3rd May, 1939.)

- 1. In this Act, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or Definitions. context.
 - (a) "animal" includes all members of the animal kingdom;
 - (b) "import" means to bring into the Union of Burma by sea, land or air, and
 - (c) "disease" means any disease which may be communicated to man or animals.
- 2 (1) The President of the Union may, by notification, prohibit or Powers of regulate, subject to such restrictions and conditions as he may impose, the to regulate import into the Union of Burma or any part thereof of any animal or class or prohibit or species of animal which may become a pest or which may be the means of animals of introducing disease.
- (2) A notification under this section may specify any animal or class or species of animal, either generally or in any particular manner, with reference to the country of origin or the route by or the conditions under which it is imported otherwise.
- 3. A notification under section 2 shall operate as if it had been issued Operation of under section 19 of the Sea Customs Act, and the officers of customs at under secevery port shall have the same powers in respect of any animal, with regard tion 2. to the importation of which such a notification has been issued, as they have for the time being in respect of any goods, the importation of which is prohibited or restricted by the law relating to sea customs, and the law for the time being in force relating to sea customs or any such goods shall apply accordingly.

4. (1) The President of the Union may make rules for the detention, Power to inspection, test, disinfection or destruction of any animal or class or species and impose of animal in respect of which a notification has been issued under section penalties. 2, or of any animal which may have been in contact with or in proximity thereto, and for regulating the powers and duties of the officers who may be appointed in this behalf.

- (2) In making any rule under this section the President of the Union may direct that a breach thereof shall be punishable with fine, which may be extended to one thousand rupees.
- 5. No suit, prosecution or other legal proceeding shall lie against any Protection person for anything in good faith done or intended to be done under this Act. to persons acting under this Act.
