

THE PREVENTION OF VIOLENCE ABROAD ACT

*Date of commencement: 26th July, 1963*

*An Act to prohibit conspiracies, etc., in Swaziland relating to the commission of acts of violence abroad.*

*Short title.*

1. This Act may be cited as the Prevention of Violence Abroad Act, 1963.

*Conspiracies, etc., in Swaziland relating to commission of acts of violence abroad.*

2. (1) Any person who, while in Swaziland —
  - (a) conspires with any other person to commit within a state or territory other than Swaziland, or to aid or procure the commission within such state or territory of an act of violence the commission of which —
    - (i) is an offence under the law of such state or territory; and
    - (ii) in Swaziland would be an offence under the law of Swaziland; or
  - (b) incites, instigates, commands or procures any other person to commit within such state or territory any such act;

shall be guilty of an offence and liable, on conviction, to imprisonment not exceeding three years or a fine not exceeding one thousand emalengeni.

(2) References in this section to the commission of acts of violence include references to omissions done with the intention of causing violence.

*Consent of Attorney-General.*

3. No prosecution for an offence under this Act shall be brought without the written consent of the Attorney-General.
