**Summary:** VERTIC is looking to appoint a Researcher in its Verification and Monitoring Programme (VMP). The role will involve working on one or more projects across the Programme's current portfolio. The person will also contribute to bringing in work in new or existing areas. The position will involve gaining experience in the full range of activities involved in driving forward an independent technically-focused nongovernmental organization.

The VMP develops verification and monitoring solutions to enable countries to work together confidently when tackling challenging international issues. These include verification, non-proliferation and security issues related to nuclear, chemical and biological weapons at the state and non-state actor level; and issues arising from emerging technologies and the outer space and cyber operational environments. Work on these subject areas involves technical, policy and legal research and engagement with government and international government officials, diplomats, regulators, R&D, military, civil society, academia and the private sector.

### Functions and responsibilities

- Conducting research on peace and security using appropriate quantitative and qualitative methodologies and approaches;
- Drafting articles from research findings for in-house and external publications
- Presenting research findings at workshops and international conferences
